Company Vision and Programs

Introduction

An international person is someone who can communicate freely with people from other countries and who can achieve something in collaboration with them. How many people like this do you see around you? Since its establishment, Gyroscorp has been providing Fun First English programs to middle and high school students in order to foster more international people. Approximately 100,000 people have participated in our programs to date. We are convinced that many of these individuals are on the path to becoming international citizens because of their enjoyable English experience in our programs.

We recognize that our Fun First Programs offered in Japan, which encourage English motivation, are not sufficient to expand the number of international people in Japan. Therefore, in 2022, we launched PHOENIX, a short-term study abroad platform where students go to English-speaking countries and participate in practical activities. Although we are still in the start-up phase and have not yet achieved any measurable results, we hope that within 10 years, several hundred young people per year will travel to English-speaking countries through PHOENIX. These students will gain the confidence and intuition needed to become global citizens.

We also hope to build an online mechanism to expose students to English in a fun way every day at school, so that beginning in elementary school, students will be able to dream of working abroad in the future. In these ways, Gyroscorp will motivate young people to become global citizens and provide them with opportunities to take on challenges appropriate to their stage of growth. The table below summarizes our current and future efforts. We hope that 20 years from now, new internationals with high ethical standards and a sense of peace, which are the characteristics of the Japanese people, will be active on the world stage.

(3) History: Fun First English programs have been offered in Huis Ten Bosch, with a total of approximately 100,000 participants served to date. In 2022, the company entered the practical short-term study abroad business, reaching the second step in our efforts to foster international people. In the same year, Gyroscorp established Gyroscorp America LLC, a U.S. company, to carry out this business.



Our Fun First Coaches



The Fun First program employs native or fluent English speakers as coaches. They join our programs after receiving relevant classroom and hands-on training.

- Regions: We have organized coaching teams in Sasebo, the Tokyo metropolitan area, Kansai, and Iwakuni.
- Number of Coaches: We provide one coach for every eight students, but this teacher-student ratio can be lowered by raising the program fee.
- Coach Backgrounds: US military base families, international students, English conversation teachers



Fun First English Program

The first step to becoming a global citizen is to love English. Our Fun First program is designed to make you feel the joy of communicating with people from all over the world.

English program in Huis Ten Bosch





Huis Ten Bosch, a theme park designed to look like the Netherlands, is truly an exciting and unique place. Here is an introduction to some of the popular programs that we offer at this location.

SEED [Street English Edutainment]

Groups go around to our English coaches, who stand in a large area, and they discuss a pre-determined topic in English. Awards are given to the best participants after the event.

- Ouration: 60 minutes
- Number of participants: 10 to 300
- English level: Beginner to advanced
- Location: Huis Ten Bosch, School Delivery, Tokyo Skytree, Yokohama, and other school excursion destinations



Role-Play Studio

Participants rotate through the booths of various situations they will encounter on their overseas trips; students enjoy speaking English in practical conversations. Portable booths are also available for on-site visits.

- Ouration: 60 to 90 minutes
- Number of participants: 10 to 60
- ●English level: Beginner to advanced
- ●Location: Huis Ten Bosch, school delivery, English camp locations, etc.



Mission Field English

Participants walk around Huis Ten Bosch and tour the various attractions. They are challenged by quizzes at many of the destination spots.

- Ouration: 90 to 150 minutes
- Number of participants: 10 to 160
- English level: Suitable for intermediate and advanced
- ●Location: Huis Ten Bosch, Sky Tree, Yokohama, Miyajima, etc.



Junior Programs

We offer a number of easy and fun programs at Huis Ten Bosch, designed for elementary school students to experience English.


- Our, Seed: A program for students with themes such as body parts, colors, food, and numbers.
- Jr. Direction: A program where students look for a destination following instructions such as "Go straight," "turn left," etc.
- Card game: An English version of karuta for beginners.



♦The Most Fun English Camp in Japan

We combine a number of Fun First programs into 2-3 day English camps held in various locations throughout Japan.

[2 nights 3 days camp]



Story Board Making

The group will create a picture-story show with an original ending, based on a famous Japanese folktale such as Momotaro



- Location: Huis Ten Bosch, English camp sites, schools
- Contents: Use Japanese folktales such as Momotaro, Urashima Taro, Bamboo Princess, etc
- Duration: 2 hours for creating, 30 minutes for presenting

Cultural Exchange

Participants use pictures of Japanese and American cultures and discuss them in English. This helps to deepen cross-cultural understanding.



- Location: Huis Ten Bosch, English camp sites, schools
- Contents: Traditional culture, athletes, social issues, pop culture
- Duration: 1 hour

Quiz Show

Participants answer three-question timed quizzes in eight unique topics about common knowledge, and the English language.



- Location: Huis Ten Bosch, English Camp, School
- Contents: Japanese English, abbreviations, English titles, cooking, etc.
- ■Duration: 30-45 minutes

Escape Room

Participants must unlock a small box before the time bomb explodes; they must solve an English riddle to reset the timer.



- ●Location: Huis Ten Bosch, English Camp, School
- Contents: Crossword, hangman, English interrogation, iigsaw puzzle
- Duration: 1 hour

◆Tokyo Metropolitan Area Program

Fun First programs are also available in the Tokyo metropolitan area. We can also expand to the Kansai and Hiroshima regions, where we have a network of foreign coaches.

American Home Visit

Participants visit American families living in the metropolitan area and enjoy time together. Participants learn practical English while experiencing the American spirit of hospitality.



- Location: Yokosuka Air Base and other U.S. military families
- Contents: Lunch at the places visited, board games, introduction
- to Japanese culture
- Ouration: 3-4 hours

Tokyo Skytree Program

We can provide English programs at Tokyo Skytree for students going to Tokyo on school trips, etc. (Handled by Tobu Top Tours)



- Location: Tokyo Skytree
- Contents: SEED, Mission Field
- Duration: 2 hours

We will continue to take on the challenge of improving the quality of our Fun First programs so that more young people will become international citizens.

Fun First English Championship



Overseas Practical Activities PHOENIX

Gyroscorp has developed and launched the PHOENIX platform. This consists of four programs in English-speaking countries. These programs are designed to help Japanese youth build a foundation of global citizenship through practical experiences abroad. The four programs are open to everyone, from elementary school students to adults, and the lengths of stay range from one week to two months. The Southern Cross Internship program for science students is currently under development and will begin full recruitment after a pilot test. ALEX and Southern Cross are in line with the purpose of the Tobitate Scholarship from the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT). There is a high possibility that students who use our programs will be awarded the scholarship.





American Runway

This is a pre-departure intensive English training program for ALEX participants. All participants except those with sufficient English proficiency are encouraged to attend. The goal is to build confidence and basic English skills so that students can interact with Americans without fear upon their arrival in the United States. The program consists of 20 evening lessons taught online by native English speakers.



Program Fees

Fun First Program

- 1 The Fun First English program fee is calculated at 2,200 yen per person, per hour.
- 2This is the program cost for one coach for every 8 students; the hourly rate will vary depending on the coach-student ratio. (XPrices below include tax)

- ❸The time required for each program is as shown on pages 4-5. For multiple hour programs, the cost is calculated by multiplying the number of hours by the unit price.
- In the case of the Mission Field program, the admission fee to Huis Ten Bosch must be purchased separately.
- For camps that include lodging outside of Huis Ten Bosch, round-trip transportation, lodging, and meals for staff will be charged.
